### Lost Property

Are you fed up with your child/ren losing their uniform at school? Their trainers? Their jumper? Their coat? Then we have the answer for you! We have joined forces with a company called Stikins who sell sticky labels that stick to everything - clothes washing instruction labels, shoes, water bottles, lunch boxes - pretty much everything! Even better, they are very reasonably priced and dishwasher proof! This will raise funds for the school every time you place an order.

These labels simply stick in and stay in with no sewing or ironing required. They stick onto the wash-care label of clothing and fabric items and can also be used on shoes, bags, lunch boxes and water bottles.

They can be put through the washing machine at 40degrees, as well as tumble driers, microwaves or dishwashers.

There will be no reason not to name everything your child brings to school!

We have also ordered some plastic water bottles which will be available after the half term holiday from the school office. They are 330ml bottles and will cost just £1.00.

### Car Park Reminder

Please remember that the car park is for staff only and parents should not park there.

We have secure pathways either side of the entrance for you and your children to walk into school safely. We have deliveries to the school throughout the day so it is important that at the beginning and end of the day you and your children use the pathways rather than walking through the car park which is extremely dangerous.

We are considering how we can integrate some of our main universal and more specialist children's health services such as delivery of the public health 'Healthy Child Programme' and services such as children's therapies and community paediatrics, to ensure that future services are better able to meet the needs of children and families in Medway.
