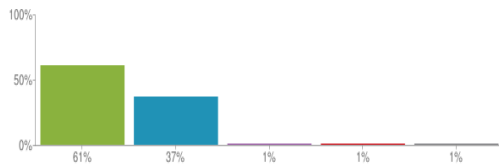
Parent View

Many thanks to those of you who completed the Parent View survey at Parent Consultation evenings just before half term.

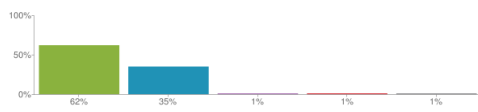

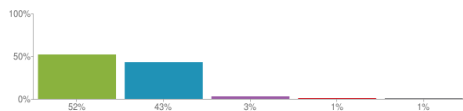

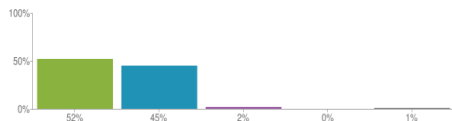
2. My child feels safe at this school



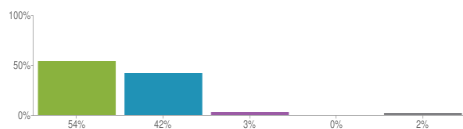
3. My child makes good progress at this school



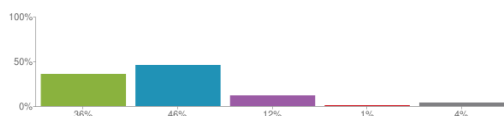
4. My child is well looked after at this school



5. My child is taught well at this school

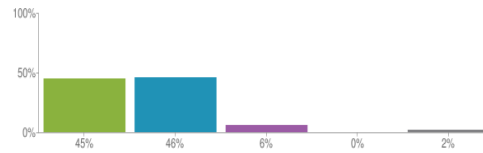

School Council

At their recent meeting, the school council have asked us to put a reminder in the newsletter about the correct uniform.

- Grey or black skirt or trousers
- White, grey or blue blouse, shirt, or polo shirt
- Navy blue sweatshirt, cardigan or fleece
- White, black or grey socks or tights
- Blue and white gingham or striped dress in summer
- Flat black shoes or black trainers

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

- The first coloured shirt in your child's team colour will be provided by the school
- Plain white, black or blue shorts
- Plain tracksuit of any colour for cold weather
- Trainers (not plimsolls) for outside sports (not the same black pair that they wear to school)
- A change of socks for outside sports
